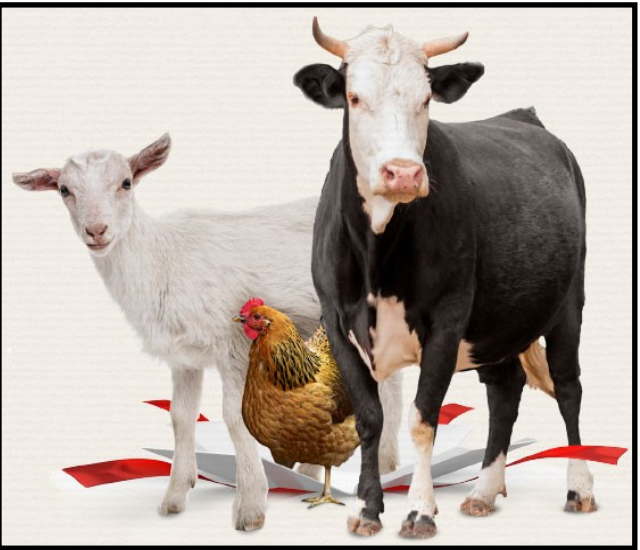
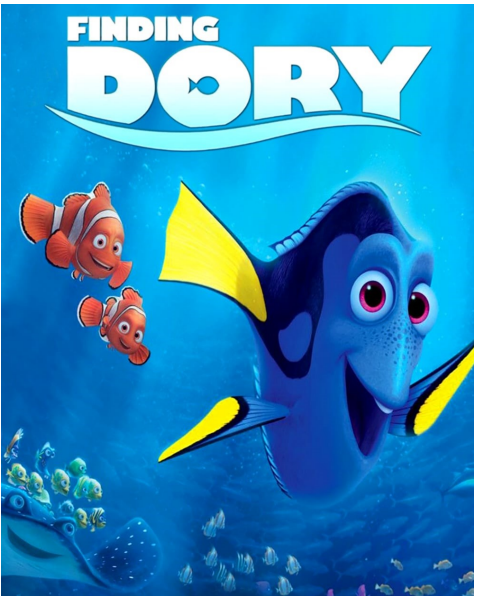

Those who made the colorful fish craft also brought home a great souvenir to remember the fun night. Thank you to Thrivent for sponsoring this event! The Sunday School would also like to thank you for participating in our Lenten Calendar Mission Project for Heifer International. We hope the calendar helped you reflect on the many blessings you have been given and how you can use your blessings to help others.



As you already may know, Heifer International helps families break the cycle of poverty by providing them with livestock and training in small scale farming. Some animals provide wool, others milk and others eggs, which can be used by the family or sold. In addition, the core of their model is to Pass on the Gift, which means families share the training they receive, and pass on the first female offspring of their livestock to another family. In this amazing way an animal donation can provide a family a hand up (not a handout) and increase their access to food, schooling, medicine and a sustainable livelihood and at the same time help to build a stronger, healthier community.

Due to the timing of Easter and Easter break, however, not all the donations have been received from our Lenten Project and the children have not yet voted on how they would like to help lift the Heifer families out of poverty.

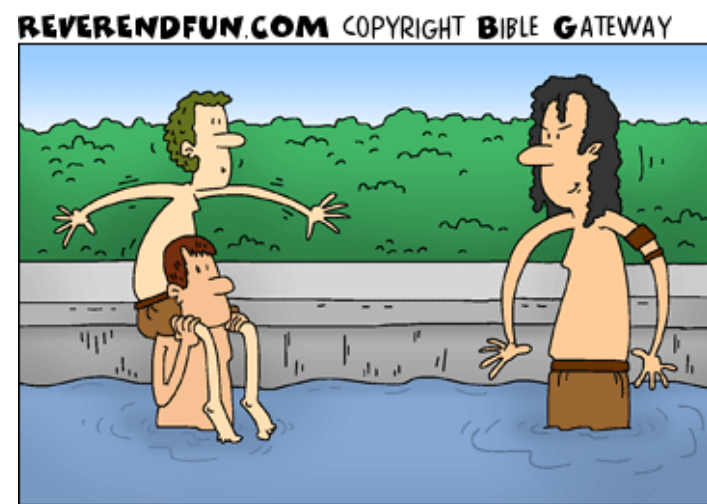

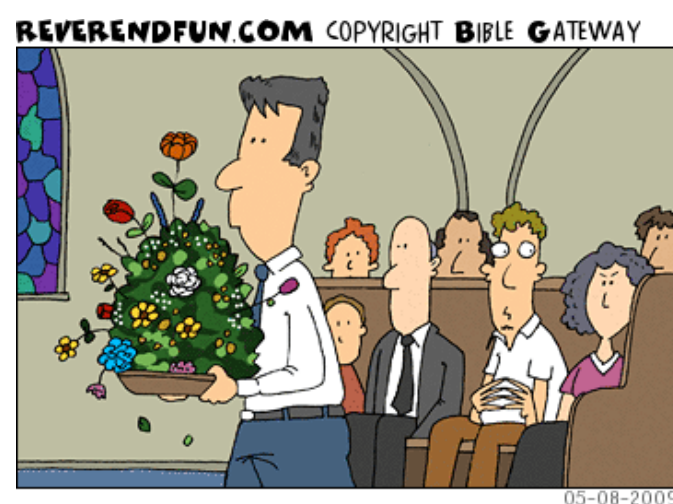
